Eagle Scout Packets Update

Since the beginning of the Scouting movement, the President of the United States has also served as Honorary Chair of the Scouting movement. The President's signature is featured on Eagle Scout certificate and wallet cards. Historically, it has taken months to get official approval to use the President's signature. We are actively working with the new administration to get this approval. As a result, there is a delay in delivering Eagle Scout certificates and wallet cards. Certificates and cards will be shipped when approval is received. This letter is being sent to new Eagle Scouts to update them on the process.

Update of Eagle Extension and Special Needs Forms

Scouting America has updated the following six forms to align with the new branding and the 2025 Guide to Advancement:

- 11.2.0.0 Request for Extension of Time (form) No. 512-077
- 11.2.1.0 Appeal of Extension Request Denial (form) No. 512-077a
- 11.3.0.0 Belated Rank Application, No. 512-076
- 11.4.0.0 Registration Beyond the Age of Eligibility, No. 512-935
- Individual Scout Advancement Plan, No. 512-936
- Application for Alternative Eagle Scout Rank Merit Badges No. 512-730

The most significant content update clarifies that only Life Scouts are eligible to apply for an extension of time to earn the Eagle Scout rank.

Motorized Equipment Use Prohibited

Reminder, there is currently no program for the use of e-bikes, other motorized equipment, wheels, or board sports in Scouting and their use is prohibited.

Motorized vehicles used as program or activities—including all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), off-road vehicles, motorized personal watercraft (PWC), snowmobiles, E-Bikes and motorized speed events (exceptions: councilapproved ATV and PWC programs that comply with <u>National Camp Accreditation Program [NCAP] standards</u>; go-karting conducted at a commercial facility that provides equipment and supervision of cart operation; youth completing the Motorboating merit badge)

Troop 316 Conservation Project

Last year Troop 316 began working with the Tuscaloosa Natural Resources Planning Committee and the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources(ADCNR) on a conservation project. The Natural Resources Committee provided the funding, and the troop built 10 wood duck nesting boxes, complete with poles, nesting material, and predator guards at scout meetings.

This weekend the troop finished assembling the boxes and being assisted by an ADCNR Wildlife Biologists Drew Tincher and Clifton Burns, installed them in several wetland locations on the Okmulgee Wildlife Management Area.

In addition to earning conservation service hours, the troop learned about career opportunities in conservation and wildlife management. They also completed the requirement for Fish and Wildlife Management Merit Badge.
