Memorial Day Emphasis

Memorial Day honors and mourns all U.S. service members who died while serving in the armed forces. Originally called Decoration Day, it began after the Civil War to honor fallen soldiers and has since expanded to include all American military personnel who gave their lives in sacrifice for their country.

Who is honored:

All U.S. service members who died in the line of duty.

Origin:

The holiday's roots are in local observances after the Civil War, with the first national commemoration called for in 1868.

Purpose:

To remember and honor the sacrifices of those who died fighting for the nation and to reflect on the cost of war and freedom.

Contrast with Veterans Day:

Memorial Day is for those who died in service, while Veterans Day honors all who have served in the U.S. military.


Commitment Form Needed from ALL Packs
