NEW PROGRAM FEE POLICY

Strengthening Scouting Beyond Your Unit – Black Warrior Council Program Fee

As a reminder, 100% of all BSA membership fees go to support the national BSA organization, none of the money stays with the local council.

The Black Warrior Council is one of only a few councils nationwide that has not implemented a "Program Fee" that is added to all membership fees. We have been able to avoid this additional fee because of the financial support of our community and units. Units that participate in Friends of Scouting (FOS) and Popcorn sale are doing their part to support Scouting council-wide.

Money raised through FOS and Popcorn sales are used to support youth and units that may be struggling financially. The funds also support the maintenance of three of our camps. In recent years the Black Warrior Council has faced increasingly challenging financial burdens due to the increased cost of insurance. Because of these increases the council has decided to implement a Program Fee.

The new Program Fee will be assessed to all units that choose not to participate in FOS and/or Popcorn sales. The fee will be \$7.00 per registered youth and adult. This fee will not be charged to units that participate in one or both of the fundraisers.

Here is how it will work:

- -Units that **do not** participate in FOS or Popcorn will be charged an additional \$7.00 per registered Scout and adult. This fee will be applied at the time the unit renews their annual charter. The fee will be calculated based on the number of active youth and adults. Units will receive a separate Program Fee invoice during recharter.
- Minimum amounts that are needed for units not to pay the Program Fee:
- o FOS units must contribute a minimum of \$200 annually
- o Popcorn Units must sell a minimum of \$500 annually
- -We encourage all units to participate in in both FOS and Popcorn sales
- -Units that participate in at least one of the fundraisers and achieve the minimum requirements will be excluded from the Program Fee.


