Key Management Topics

Visitor Policy

Everyone must check in and out from the Hulsart Center.

Vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas – no vehicles in campsites (NCAP standard).

Visitors issued lanyard for identification & verification they have checked in.

If checking out a Scout, adult must provide identification.

* Please be sure you review the visitor & check-in/out policy with parents.

GOLF CARTS

Only authorized for those with mobility issues and **MUST** be approved in advance with the Camp Director.

Campsites

We realize most everyone has that favorite campsite and we will do all possible to assign your unit to that campsite but please realize, campsite assignments have to adhere to:

- camp attendance numbers vs. accommodations in each site
- provisions for Youth Protection Guidelines
- National Camp Accreditation Program (NCAP) Standards

Unit Leadership Reminders

- Maintain two-deep leadership at all times
- One-on-one contact between adults and youth is strictly prohibited
- Youth may only tent with other youth within 2 years of their age or their own parent/legal guardian
- ALL adults staying in camp must have **current** Youth Protection Training certification

Pets

Pets are not allowed in camp per NCAP/BSA policies.

If a service animal is needed, please discuss this in **ADVANCE** with the Camp Director.

Shot records for service animals are required.

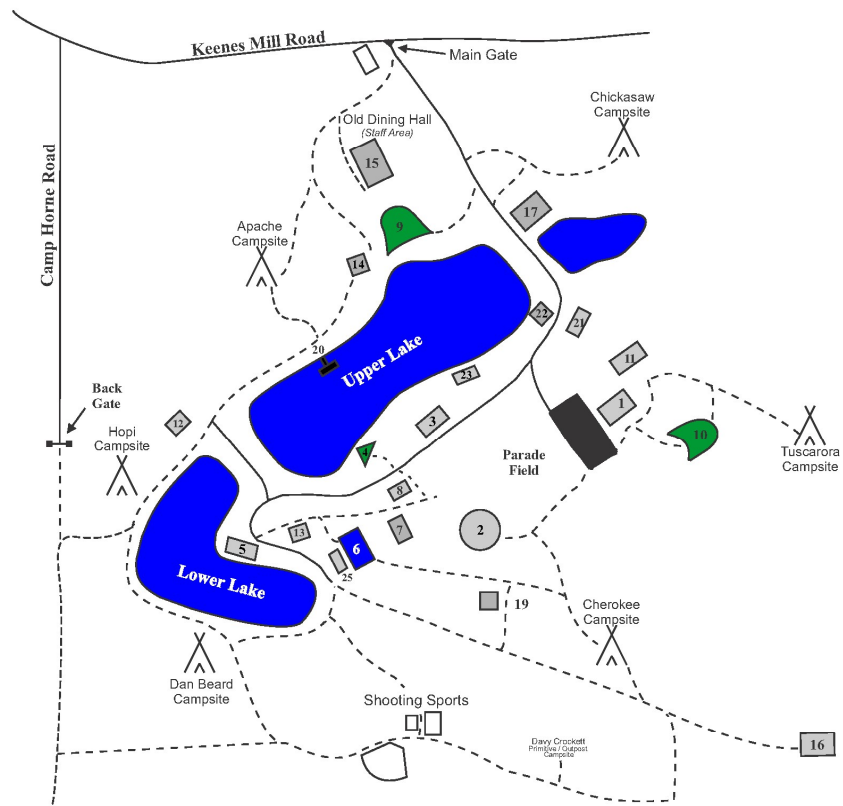

Essential Steps for a Successful Camp

- **READ** the Leaders' Guide! Review the information with other leaders.
- **REGISTER** your unit now! Payments may be made over time but secure your place at camp!
- **INFORM** Cubs, Scouts and Parents about Health & Medical Form requirements – set an early deadline to collect & CHECK dates, signatures
- **CONSIDER** early swim tests but carefully follow guidelines – be sure to secure a copy of the tester's unexpired lifeguard certification to attach
- **COWBOY ACTION SHOOT? ATV PROGRAM?** Be sure to review special requirements, collect required paperwork, bring all to camp!
- **PLAN** advancement program related to merit badge offerings (use troop meetings ahead of camp to complete pre-requisites); who will be in the Trailblazer's program?
- **CHECK** camp webpages periodically for any updates.
- **PAY** all fees no later than May 24, 2024 (\$25 per person increase after this date).
